

Jesus was kind and good, and so is God, His Father. Jesus had a hard life and died a very sad death, but He did it all so we wouldn't have to die. He wants us to be happy with Him in heaven forever. That is why Jesus came to this earth and became a human being like us.

Jesus lived and suffered and died to save you and me from sin and death. He took away our sadness so we could be happy forever. Jesus knows the Father so well that He was able to teach us just how great God's love is. Jesus gave everything He had, and He even died, so that people could go to heaven and be with Him.

God loved us so much that He gave Jesus to live on earth and then to die for us (John 3:16). People are naturally sinful and do bad things, but God sent Jesus to make us good and pure again. Jesus became a man so that He could show us that He understands what we need. When Jesus became a human being, He became one forever—so we could always know that He is our Brother (Hebrews 2:11).
